

San Antonio's River Walk is the lively heartbeat of the city and the ideal starting spot for your visit. This lush, winding pathway is tucked just below street level, lined with charming cafés, boutiques, and vibrant umbrellas, perfect for a leisurely daytime stroll or a festive evening out surrounded by music and glowing lights. When you're hungry, you'll find excellent restaurants like Boudro's Texas Bistro, where the tableside guacamole and prickly pear margaritas are legendary, or Domingo, which adds a contemporary twist to classic Tex-Mex dishes, served alongside fantastic cocktails and riverside views.

You can't truly experience San Antonio without visiting The Alamo, an iconic downtown mission steeped in Texas history. A stroll through its historic grounds and chapel is both inspiring and completely free. For a different perspective, head to the Tower of the Americas, a 750-foot-tall observation tower offering spectacular city views, especially stunning at sunset. Enjoy dinner or drinks at the revolving restaurant atop the tower as you watch the city sparkle to life below. If outdoor adventure calls your name, rent a kayak or bike to explore miles of scenic trails along the river and around the city's beautiful parks, enjoying San Antonio's warm sunshine almost year-round.

As the sun sets, immerse yourself in San Antonio's vibrant music and nightlife scene. For live tunes in an intimate atmosphere, visit LUNA, a beloved spot for jazz, blues, and soulful local performances, perfect for sipping cocktails and soaking in the city's musical vibe. Watch for spontaneous mariachi bands serenading visitors along the River Walk or try two-stepping in a classic Texas dance hall. Sports lovers won't feel left out, as the city's passion for the Spurs basketball team brings fans together at energetic sports bars and arenas throughout the season. Whether your idea of fun includes history, outdoor exploration, delicious food, or lively nightlife, San Antonio has something memorable waiting for you.

BEYOND THE CITY —

FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS

Just over an hour from San Antonio, Fredericksburg seamlessly blends its rich German heritage with the scenic charm of the Hill Country. This historic town is packed with boutique shops, art galleries, and beautifully preserved limestone buildings. Visitors can explore the National Museum of the Pacific War, take a leisurely walk down Main Street, or hike the massive pink granite dome at Enchanted Rock State Natural Area for panoramic views. The region is also renowned for its wine, boasting over 50 wineries and tasting rooms nestled among the rolling hills. During spring, wildflower fields burst into bloom, making the area a photographer's dream. After a day of exploring, enjoy schnitzel and bratwurst at a cozy biergarten, indulge in strudel at a German bakery, or relax with live music and a glass of Texas wine at Hondo's on Main.

NEW BRAUNFELS & GRUENE, TEXAS

New Braunfels and its nearby neighbor, Gruene, offer a delightful mix of outdoor recreation, cultural heritage, and live music, just under an hour from San Antonio. Float the crystal-clear waters of the Comal or Guadalupe Rivers or spend the day at the sprawling Schlitterbahn Waterpark. History comes alive in New Braunfels' downtown, while Gruene's lovingly preserved buildings exude old Texas charm. Gruene Hall, the oldest dance hall in Texas, continues to host daily live music under a canopy of string lights and rustic wooden beams. Shoppers will enjoy local boutiques and antique shops, while food lovers can indulge in hearty meals at The Gristmill overlooking the river. Top off the experience with a sweet treat from Naegelin's Bakery or a cold beer at a riverside tavern.

AUSTIN, TEXAS

A dynamic mix of culture, creativity, and outdoor appeal, Austin offers something for everyone just 90 minutes from San Antonio. Tour the grand Texas Capitol, then explore the quirky neighborhoods of South Congress, known for its murals, music, and local boutiques. Lady Bird Lake provides a picturesque spot for kayaking or paddleboarding, while Barton Springs Pool is a favorite for

cooling off. The city's renowned food scene encompasses everything from food truck tacos and smoky brisket to upscale dining experiences. In the evening, catch the incredible bat emergence from under the Congress Avenue Bridge or dive into the music scene on Sixth Street or Rainey Street. Whether you're into art, history, nature, or nightlife, Austin never disappoints.

BANDERA, TEXAS

A trip to Bandera, the self-proclaimed Cowboy Capital of the World, feels like stepping into a classic Western movie. Just an hour west of San Antonio, this small town is known for its rich cowboy culture, complete with horseback riding, rodeos, and staged shootouts on Main Street. Visit the Frontier Times Museum to explore artifacts from the Old West or spend time at a guest ranch for an authentic trail ride experience. Restaurants like the OST serve up Texas-sized portions of comfort food, and live music at Arkey Blue's Silver Dollar Saloon or 11th Street Cowboy Bar keeps the town buzzing after dark. Bandera's relaxed pace, rustic charm, and Western hospitality offer a fun and memorable escape.

LOCKHART, TEXAS

Lockhart, about an hour from San Antonio, is a must for barbecue lovers and small-town explorers alike. Known as the Barbecue Capital of Texas, the town is home to legendary joints like Black's, Kreuz Market, and Smitty's, each with its own style and loyal fan base. Between savory meals, visitors can explore the grand Caldwell County Courthouse, browse antique shops, or visit the historic jail-turned-museum. The town exudes a warm, welcoming vibe that pairs perfectly with sweet tea, cobbler, and a relaxed afternoon stroll. If you're a food lover or history buff, Lockhart makes for a flavorful and satisfying day trip.
